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1. GENERAL INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1.1 Background and Introduction

The Air Traffic and Navigation Services (ATNS) Company of South Africa is the major provider of air traffic management, communication, surveillance, navigation and associated services (including training) within South Africa. ATNS manages 10% of the world's airspace.

Standing strong with over 1100 employees, ATNS strives to continuously provide safe airspace, orderly, expeditious and efficient management of Air Traffic Management services. The company operates at 21 aerodromes within the country, including OR Tambo, Cape Town and King Shaka International Airports.

In the rest of the African Continent, ATNS provides amongst others the Aeronautical Satellite Communication (VSAT) networks.

This service extends from Cape to Cairo interconnecting more than 33 states in Africa and Middle East. Other services include ATS and technical training, WGS 84 surveys, airspace design, AIP documentation, billing and consultancy services.

Vision

ATNS's Vision is to be the preferred supplier of air traffic management solutions and associated services to the African continent and selected international markets.

Our Mission is to provide safe, expeditious and efficient air traffic management solutions and associated services, whilst ensuring long-term economic, social and environmental sustainability.

The Air Traffic and Navigation Service Company Limited (ATNS) is a State-Owned Company (SOC), established in 1993 in terms of the ATNS Company Act (Act 45 of 1993) to provide air traffic management solutions and associated services on behalf of the State. These services accord with International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) standards and recommended practices, and the South African Civil Aviation Regulations and Technical Standards. As an air navigation services provider (ANSP), ATNS is governed by the nation's legislative and administrative framework.

ATNS is also a commercialised ANSP operating on the "user pays" principle that relies on current revenues and debt funding for its operational and capital expenditure requirements.

Our business offerings are divided into Regulated and non-regulated activities:

Regulated Business

At present 90% of ATNS's revenue is facilitated through its regulated business:

Air navigation services and infrastructure

The principal activities of ATNS's regulated business encompass the planning, operating and maintenance of safe and efficient air traffic management services in the airspace for which the State is responsible. Airspace infrastructure consists of the following main components:

- Communications, navigation and surveillance (CNS) infrastructure.
- Auxiliary aviation services, such as aeronautical information publications, flight procedure design and aeronautical surveys.
- Air traffic management.

ATNS's infrastructure development is informed by user expectations and regulatory requirements at a global level; as well as the needs of the air traffic management (ATM) community and new enabling technologies.

Air traffic service charges

As a monopoly service provider, ATNS is regulated economically by the Economic Regulating Committee (RC) that is a statutory body formed and appointed by the

Shareholder, the Department of Transport (DoT). The RC is empowered by the ATNS Company Act (Act 45 of 1993) to issue permission to ATNS. The permission regulates the increase in specified tariffs that ATNS can issue and lays down minimum service standards requirements for the regulated business. ATNS is, through the permission, authorized to levy air traffic service charges on users (aircraft operators) for the use of air navigation infrastructure and/or the provision of an air traffic service. The permission has a five-year life span.

Training institution

ATNS runs a successful training institution as a division within the Company, namely: the Aviation Training Academy (ATA). The ATA provides a full range of air traffic services training, technical support training and related training to delegates in South Africa and the broader African continent in the disciplines of engineering, air traffic services and management. The ATA is an ISO9001:2000 accredited institution and has international cooperation agreements in place with partners, enabling the academy to maintain mutually beneficial partnerships in the presentation and accreditation of international courses in air traffic services (ATS). The ATA is a world-renowned academy, and in both 2012 and 2013 was formally recognized as the International Air Transport Association (IATA) Worldwide Top Regional Training Partner.

Non-Regulated Business

ATNS's non-regulated business currently contributes 10% of the Company's revenue. The non-regulated business encompasses a long-term strategy to facilitate regional expansion through a subsidiary vehicle presently known as "ATNS International". ATNS International will enable the Company to take a more robust and agile stance in the non-regulated business market without posing undue risks to its regulated market and Shareholder. It will also enable ATNS to enter into joint ventures and partnerships with external suppliers so that the Company can harness more valuable market opportunities and extend its regional influence and reach.

1.2 Purpose of the Bid

- The appointment of a service provider to provide fire detection and suppression system, fire equipment services and PA system maintenance at ATNS King Shaka International Airport (FALE) Control Tower and its sites for a period of five (5) years.
- The bidder must demonstrate the capability to perform effective fire maintenance services in accordance with all legal and statutory requirements.

1.3 Scope of Work

- Fire detection and suppression systems and firefighting equipment routine checks and maintenance are to be done every three (3) months or as agreed with the ATNS management at the ATNS King Shaka Control Tower and Bluff Radar site.
- Yearly servicing of fire extinguishers, fire hoses and fire hydrants.
- Conduct AD-HOC fire detection and suppression system, and firefighting equipment repairs as requested by management on quotation basis, this includes callout and emergency responses.
- Carry out any additional work over and above the scheduled maintenance services which ATNS may require to maintain the sites in a proper and safe working condition. This includes fire services work on all ATNS King Shaka sites.
- Attendance and reporting to the ATNS King Shaka Management on a half yearly basis for any significant findings identified during the service and maintenance activities.
- Supply any parts or components that may be required for maintenance purpose during the period of this agreement. (Market related prices)
- If uneconomical to maintain or to repair, supply new fire detection and suppression systems, firefighting equipment to replace the failed units on critical equipment and buildings.
- Commissioning of the new fire detection and suppression system or firefighting equipment unit and provide site acceptance test documents.
- Recommend on required repairs after maintenance/inspections.
- Provide a 12 Month maintenance and guarantee on all new installations.

1.4 General

- Provide all materials, labour, and transport to complete maintenance, the removal of existing items/units and the installation of the new items/units.
- In the case of new installations, the contractor must remove existing items/units and install new units and leave area of work neat and tidy on completion. Dispose the replaced item and provide disposal certificates.
- The Pricing schedules must include all preparations, materials, labour and transport costs.
- All service reports and working papers shall remain the property of ATNS.
- The supplier must create and submit an OHS Safety file.
- The service provider shall always remain fully and solely responsible for the timeous delivery of service/goods to ATNS.

1.5 Quality

1.5.1 Quality Standards

- The delivery of services to ATNS Shall be carried out with best quality and to a high class of workmanship
- Product delivered/used at ATNS should be certified with SABS or equivalent, In the event where ATNS elects to accept an alternative item purported to be equal/similar by the tenderer, acceptance of the item(s) will be conditional on ATNS's inspection and testing after receipt.
- If, in the sole judgment of ATNS, the commodities are determined not to be within SABS/SANS national specifications, the supplier will be requested to replace the items with the items that complies with SABS/SANS national specifications immediately at no additional cost to ATNS.
- ATNS may from time to time test the quality of the products and services, non-compliance may result in the termination of the contract.
- All product items should carry (minimum of 1 year) guarantees or warranties and defects items will be replaced at the cost of the service provider. It will be the

responsibility of the service provider to ensure that the products are replaced (Retailers to Manufacturers), where applicable.

1.5.2 Quality Tests

- ATNS may from time to time test the quality of services and non-compliance may result in the termination of the contract.

1.6 Contractors Responsibility

- Provide all the necessary skills, resources, tools, equipment, and experts to carry out the work as stipulated on the contract as a minimum requirement, the successful supplier must have a Qualified SAQCC-Fire, and an authorized Practitioner by Department of Labour. ASIB
- Review, familiarize and understand the proposed sites including all constraints and environmental factors.
- Review, familiarize and understand the operational requirements of the facilities at all ATNS sites.
- Conduct any other reasonable works required to successfully deliver the services to ATNS on time, on budget, at the accepted quality.
- Hand over all documentation including condition reports after services, repairs, and installations
- Assist FALE OHAS Team & technical personnel with minimal training on the basics of the fire system end user responsibilities.
- Provide sound guidance and an expert opinion around fire system regulations and requirements as and when needed.

- 2.4.14 Bidders should allow time to access the premises due to security arrangements that need to be observed.

2.4.15 Should a bidder require to submit their documents online, they must send an email to olwethuf@atns.co.za and copy tenders@atns.co.za to express their interest to do so. On the email bidders must specify on the subject line – the tender number and description. A link will be shared with the supplier for uploading the documents on a secure online portal. **Deadline for requesting the link is two days before closing date, email sent after this deadline will not be attended to.**

2.5 LATE BIDS

2.5.1 Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived even one second after closing time or any time thereafter. The tender (bid) box shall be locked at exactly 13h00 CAT and bids arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances.

2.5.2 Bids uploaded after closing date and time online will not be considered.

2.6 NEGOTIATION AND CONTRACTING

2.6.1 ATNS have the right to enter into negotiation with one or more bidders regarding any terms and conditions, including price(s), of a proposed contract.

2.6.2 ATNS shall not be obliged to accept the lowest of any quotation, offer or proposal.

2.6.3 Under no circumstances will negotiation with any bidders constitute an award or promise / undertaking to award the contract.

2.7 REASONS FOR REJECTION

2.7.1 ATNS shall reject a proposal for the award of a contract if the recommended bidder has committed a proven corrupt or fraudulent act in competing for the particular contract.

2.7.2 ATNS may disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors:

2.7.3 Have abused the SCM system of ATNS.

2.7.4 Have committed proven fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such system.

2.7.5 Have failed to perform on any previous contract and the proof exists.

2.7.6 Such actions shall be communicated to the National Treasury.

2.8 CANCELLATION OF PROCUREMENT PROCESS

2.8.1 This procurement process can be postponed or cancelled at any stage.

2.9 CONTRACT TERMS

2.9.1 Whilst ATNS have taken every reasonable step to ensure the accuracy of this brief, the Company accepts no liability in relation to the accuracy of any representation made. Bidder should accept that their Bid response is on the basis and reliance of its own judgment and information. ATNS reserves the right to vary the scope and terms as described in this document although variation is not anticipated at this time. If any variation does take place Bidder will be advised as soon as possible.

2.9.2 The successful Bidder will be engaged subject to acceptance of a contract containing the standard Terms and Conditions as given in GCC. The contract contains standard clauses including a retention clause for non-satisfactory completion, breach of contract and confidentiality clauses and a requirement for the Bidder to have adequate professional indemnity insurance. All Bidders must bear in mind that if circumstances dictate, ATNS reserves its right to withdraw from any commitments that will be entered into within this statement of work.

2.9.3 All documentations will be the property of ATNS.

2.10 DISCLAIMER

2.10.1 The Bidder shall bear all costs incurred by him in connection with the preparation and submission of his Bid Response and for finalization of the contract and the attachments thereof. ATNS will in no case be responsible for payment to the Bidder for these costs.

2.10.2 The Company reserves the right to reject any or all Bids, to undertake discussions with one or more Bidders, and to accept that Bid or modified Bid which in its sole judgment, will be most advantageous to the Company, price and other evaluation factors having been considered.

3 EVALUATION PROCESS

3.1 COMPLIANCE WITH MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS CRITERIA

3.1.1 All bids duly lodged as specified in this Request for Bid will be examined to determine compliance with bidding requirements and conditions. Bids with deviations from the requirements / conditions, will be eliminated from further consideration.

3.2 TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS, PRICE AND PREFERENCE POINTS

3.2.1 All remaining bids will be evaluated as follows:

3.2.2 **The First stage:** Bids will be evaluated first for **pre-qualification criteria (preferential procurement requirements)** prescribed in Preferential Procurement Regulations. Only bids that meet Preferential Procurement requirements will be considered for further evaluation.

3.2.3 **The Second stage:** Bids will be evaluated for **mandatory technical requirements**. During this stage, Tender response documentation will be evaluated against compliance to the Mandatory documents required. Failure to submit Mandatory documents will result in disqualification.

3.2.4 **The Third stage:** Bids will be evaluated in terms of the **80/20 preference point systems**. Only bids that provide all documentation requested for **technical requirements** will be evaluated in accordance with the **80/20** preference point system.

3.3 PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REFORM:
